

How to make a Suncatcher

You will need:

Greaseproof paper or tissue paper A bendy stick or 3 wooden skewers PVA Glue and paintbrush/glue spreader/bit of card Pressed flowers and or leaves pen/pencil



Cotton or string or wool

Pick some leaves flowers and press them in a book, flatter flowers are better, or just press the petals. Leave overnight or longer if possible.

Step 1.

Meanwhile, make the frame, by bending your stick (Willow is good for this) and fixing the ends together, tie with cotton or string if necessary. Place onto a piece of greaseproof paper or tissue paper and draw around it, adding about a centimetre margin. Then glue around the edges and fold them into the middle, sticking them down. Leave to dry.



Step 3.

If you don't have a bendy stick, arrange 3 skewers into the shape of a triangle onto a sheet of greaseproof paper/tissue paper, cut around them, leaving about a cm around the edge, then glue down the edges over the skewers. Leave to dry.



Step 4.

Next take your pressed flowers/petals/leaves and arrange them into the design that you're happy with on your frame. Stick them down with your PVA glue and paintbrush or spreader. Leave to dry.



Step 5.

When dry, you can always paint over the top of them with the PVA to make it stronger.



Step 6.

Make a small hole near the top of of your suncatcher, thread a length of cotton or wool through the hole, tie a knot in it and voila – you're done.



Now make more, and hang it in your sunniest window. Spring leaves and daisies make great shapes, and summer flowers look beautiful!
